

## Rewrite Rules

You may rewrite the problems that you missed on the exam for up to 1/3 of your points back with the exception of #4.

- Problems will be graded on an all-or-nothing basis. No partial credit will be given. You must show your work to receive credit.
- On a clean separate sheet of paper, clearly number and rework the problems you wish to earn credit back on.
- If you missed one part of a multipart problem, you do not need to rework all of the problem, but all relevant work must be shown. For example, if you're using part (b) of a problem that you got correct, to do part (c) that you missed, you must rework part (b).
- Each problem that you rewrite should be accompanied by a sentence (a complete sentence) that explains why you missed it. It needs to be more insightful than "Because I didn't know how to do it".
