

UNIX / BSD / Linux Cheatsheet

Login to server

from *nix machine	ssh username@hostname
from Windows	powershell – ssh bitvise moba xterm

Logout of the server

Type “exit” and hit <ENTER> to quit a ssh session.

Directory commands

Change to directory	cd <i>dirname</i>
Goto home directory	cd
Make a new directory	mkdir <i>dirname</i>
Remove a directory	rmdir <i>dirname</i>
Move a directory	mv <i>olddirname newdirname</i>
Rename directory	mv <i>olddirname newdirname</i>

File commands

Copy a file	cp <i>filename copyname</i>
Delete a file	rm <i>filename</i>
Move a file	mv <i>oldfilename newfilename</i>
Rename a file	mv <i>oldfilename newfilename</i>

Compile a C program with Clang

Compile to a.out	clang <i>programe</i>
Compile to <i>name</i>	clang -o <i>name programe</i>
Enable warnings	clang -Wall <i>programe</i>

Compile a C++ program with Clang

Same as C except replace “clang” with “clang++”

Note: on the CS server gcc and g++ invoke clang.

Terminal multiplexer

tmux – see tmux(1) by typing *man tmux* in the shell

Manual pages

Searching for man pages	<i>apropos keyword</i>
Viewing the man page	<i>man keyword</i> Use PGUP and PGDN or arrow keys to navigate Type “q” to quit

Anytime you see a keyword followed by parentheses with a number, that is a reference to a man page. For example, in CS 360 we will use the coding style described in *style(9)* for all of our programs. Type “man *style*” to view this man page.
